Tins of meat and fish, microwaveable pouches of rice, pot noodles, tea, coffee and sugar. For the winter – thick socks and warm coats, sleeping bags and rucksacks are often required. Also, period products, deodorants, razors and shaving cream.

Following the service there will be a “Bring and Share” Lunch. Everyone welcome – come along for a bite to eat and a chat.

PASTORAL LETTER

Dear Christ Church

Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord.

Psalms 27.14

Waiting is a spiritual discipline that Christ Church is now very good at indeed. We have been waiting for decades to redevelop our main site and are still waiting now for the Grove Road sale to complete. At a recent conference in Durham, I learnt of the Pentecostal tradition of tarrying at the altar. Tarrying means to wait, linger or delay. *Wolfgang Vondey from the University of Birmingham said: "Tarrying together at the altar opens room for listening and speaking with God and with one another, a way to see the other in light of the encounter with God".*

In this sense, waiting for God to act helps us to hear God more clearly, and to join together as a church watching for a move of God's power. All of this waiting is helping us as a church to be expectant in hope, to be looking forward to God's leading.

While it is undoubtedly stressful and annoying to be waiting again, let us linger in this spiritual state. What can God teach us now? How has this experience altered our plans? Too often Christians want God to lead but act from their own power. In our case, there is nothing we can do, but wait for the Lord. It is always better to wait on him as Habbukkuk 2.3 says: ³For the vision *is* yet for an appointed time; But at the end it will speak, and it will not lie. Though it tarries, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry (forever).

May we delight in tarrying in God's presence together. When we tarry, the result is: 'a shared turning of hearts and minds toward God so that the faithful can walk together on the way and in the same direction' (Vondey, 2023). Wait for the Lord, be strong and take heart, and wait for the Lord together.
