Harvest appeal for HAB

This Harvest we are supporting the work of Homeless Action in Barnet – HAB. HAB opened in 1997, and this year there were 12,237 visits to the centre. Each of the 250 people who visit HAB weekly receive a welcome, food and a hot shower along with support to help overcome their issues and ultimately assist them in finding accommodation and their own independence.

HAB provides all of these additional services:

- Free internet access, and computers to use
- A clothes store
- Laundry facilities
- Someone to talk to who will listen
- Advocacy & Counselling
- Help to access housing advice
- Referral to winter night shelters & tenancy support
- Access to medical services including a GP and nurse
- Creative and wellbeing workshops

As you know in lockdown many homeless people were given temporary accommodation. HAB provided support and food packages to over 100 people in temporary accommodation. HAB have launched a Moving On Appeal to help people now to find long-term housing.

As we enter the next phase of the governments support program, the help needed is changing again. People are moving from temporary accommodation to longer term housing and need support with setting up in their new home. So, to get ready for this, HAB have launched the Moving On

Appeal which provides starter kits for homeless people by providing bedding and kitchenware.

Sermon

I came across a sweet story in the Sun newspaper recently about a man called Jack who was begging for spare change on the street. He called out can you spare 50p? A woman called Toni stopped and gave him a few coins but then broke down in tears. When she explained she couldn't afford her electric bill, Jack gave her change back – you need it more he said.

Do you feel weary like Toni did? Tired of not having enough to get by, or weary of others asking for help, weary of covid-19 restrictions? Weary from six months of worrying about how to do ordinary things in PPE, weary of the news and anxious for any future lockdowns that may come.

The book of Isaiah is a record of the prophecies and speeches Isaiah gives to the people of God. Before the Holy Spirit was given to the disciples at Pentecost, this is how the Spirit of God spoke – through prophets just like Isaiah. It's written in about 8BC and from Jerusalem. Isaiah is talking to the people of God and they were weary. Weary, tired, beat up and spent. The people of God are not living at home. They have been forced to leave their country and work as slaves in Babylon. The people of God are oppressed and powerless, crushed and without hope. It is a bleak existence.

Into this weary-hearted nation, Isaiah speaks over many, many chapters, but here in this small part he shares a core message from the entire book:

The Lord is the everlasting God
The Lord created the world.

Isaiah is reminding the people of God about God, about who he is and how he never changes. For God remains, God is sovereign, God is all powerful and has made

us all. Knowing these things is not a quick fix, but instead lays the strongest foundation for our life with God.

He instead encourages the people to wait on the Lord. To wait patiently on him and to rest trusting in him. In other words, he asks the people of God to be in a relationship with God. Good relationships are built on knowing each other, spending time with each other, patience and trust. I wonder how the last six months has been in your relationship with God? Maybe it's time for all of us to reset our relationship with God, to dwell in his presence and trust in him.

Jack and Toni started to become friends after meeting on the street. Over the years they built a strong and honest relationship and are now happily married. Jack said the 50p he gave to Toni was the best 50p he ever spent. Their relationship began with honesty. When we are honest with God about how weary we are, how frustrated we may be, he offers us his presence. He offers us a relationship with the creator of the world. If we allow him to still our fears, to trust him and to wait patiently on him he is able to offer us hope. Where we feel weak, he makes us strong. Where we feel tired he renews us. We are transformed by our relationship with God so much that we can fly like eagles. It is this trusting and resting in God's presence that sustains us and strengthens us.

As we learn to trust God even in our weary hearts, he offers strength in two forms. One is running and one is walking. There are extraordinary times when God provides enormous levels of power to us to do incredible acts of kindness, witness and service for him. And then there is the more regular kind. For as much as God restores, renews and enables us to run, he also sustains our everyday walk in our everyday lives. For every journey we have to make

wearing a mask, with every pump of hand sanitiser, for every complex one-way system in a building or shop – he can sustain us. For every challenging friend, neighbour or family member – he can sustain us, God can help us.

May each of us know God's goodness today, may each of us rest in his presence, be restored by his peace and so know his strength to walk and not be weary.

Those who trust in the Lord for help, will find their strength renewed. Amen
