All-Age Talk

I have three Ps to explain Pentecost, the
coming of the Holy Spirit to the first disciple
of Jesus. Can anyone guess what each of the
Ps stand for?

1st P – Promise: The gift of the Holy Spirit,
Jesus promised His disciples arrived ten days
after He went up to heaven. The disciples
received the Holy Spirit in a miraculous way
through **Wind** (Swoosh) and **Fire** (Sizzling)
2nd P -Power: The gift of the Holy Spirit
gave the disciples the ability to follow Jesus.

He gave them the boldness to carry on the work of Jesus. The work of telling everyone God loves them. That He wants everyone to become part of His big family and forever Kingdom. That everyone, yellow, white, black or brown who decides to follow Jesus is welcome by God.

3rd P - Presence: Jesus told His disciples before he left that, he will be with them at all times and forever. The Holy Spirit came to remind them Jesus is with them at all times. That he will rejoice with them when happy. Comfort them when sad; Guide and care for them.

Jesus is willing and very much want everyone to receive this same gift of the Holy Spirit. He wants everyone to have the power of God to do His work and to know the presence of God at all times. To enjoy this gift ask Jesus to forgive you for living your own way. Believe Jesus died and rose again so that we might be forgiven and ask Him to be the ruler of your life. **Amen**

Why celebrate Pentecost'?

I had an interesting conversation a few weeks ago with someone who was wary the lockdown will soon come to an end. He felt safer indoors. He was glad not to have entertained or interacted with anyone for so many months. I guess he is not alone. It is natural to be wary and scared after the devastation we had all witnessed in the last fourteen months. He could do with some help to overcome his fear and to move forward.

The first disciples of Jesus too were wary and frightened after Jesus ascended to heaven. If the authorities could do such horrible things

to their leader, what chance had they not to suffer from persecution too?

The disciples definitely needed help to move forward. Jesus told the disciples to wait in Jerusalem for the gift He will send to them after he had ascended to heaven. This promised gift, the Holy Spirit, also known as the Advocate or Helper arrived ten days after the ascension of Jesus. It arrived on the same day as the feast of Weeks, which is celebrated fifty days after the Passover. Many of the Jews living inside and outside Israel as far as Greece and Rome, were in Jerusalem for the celebration. The feast of weeks is to thank God for the Spring Harvest and to pray for a bounteous autumn harvest. It is also seen by some as a time of covenant renewal and new birth. A time of moving forward and of taking up new opportunities.

Today we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, in remembrance of the day The Holy Spirit first came. Pentecost Sunday is also known as the Birthday of the Church. On this day, we remember how the miraculous, much needed gift gave the first twelve disciples the courage to move forward and propelled the onset of Christianity. Acts 2 vs 2v - 4 and 9 say, 'suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. Everyone heard the disciples speaking in their different languages. It was not a mystical event like the Transfiguration which was witnessed by just three disciples. The arrival of the Holy Spirit was an outpouring of God's energy, seen and

heard by everyone present. Everyone in Jerusalem heard the disciples in their various languages. A communication miracle much needed in today's world to break down barriers, prevent war, injustice, violence and abuse. The unleashed God's Spirit was nothing to do with being drunk as pointed out by Peter to the critics. The Holy Spirit is the fulfilment of part of Joel's prophecy which Peter quoted in verses Acts 2 vs. 17-21.

The Holy Spirit, the Power of God, gave the disciples a sudden, much needed new life. He gave them the boldness to speak the truth about Jesus. To tell those present, that through His death on the cross and resurrection on the third day, our sins are forgiven by God. That accepting Jesus as Lord and Saviour is the only way to eternal redemption. He gave them the power continue telling everyone this Good News all over Judea, Samaria and much farther as Jesus commanded before He ascended to heaven.

We celebrate Pentecost, the Power of God, because it propelled not just the onset of Christianity but also its continuation over two thousand years afterwards. The Holy Spirit, is who helps us turn away from darkness to the light of Jesus on hearing of God's grace and love. Binding us together as the body of Christ, the Church, despite our diversity and differences. Empowering the church to continually share the Good News of Jesus, pray, and encourage others as we stride towards God's ultimate plan. The plan for all people to turn away from doing things their way. To accept Jesus as Lord and Saviour. To propel the second coming of Jesus and for everyone to be part of God's eternal Kingdom.

Another reason we celebrate Pentecost is He enables our faith, testimony and acceptance of the truth about God. What truth you might ask? The truth that the birth, death and the resurrection of Jesus Christ are for us! That we are God's beloved children. Spirit-filled from the day we get baptised and adopted into God's family. That all the promises of God in the Bible are unfailing truths. That God is no longer distant from us but intimately connected to our life. That He is with us all through the ups and downs of our life-journey. Comforting us when we are sad, lifting us up when we are down and reminding us that our eternity with Jesus in heaven is assured.

The global pandemic had shaken some people's faith in Jesus. Some of us have become a bit indifferent or lukewarm about the Good News of Jesus. Some also struggle to believe He loves them. Brothers and Sisters, are you indifferent or struggling to believe in the power and presence of God after all you have been through? On this Pentecost Sunday, ask Jesus afresh for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit to empower and strongly reassure you of His love, truth and presence. If lukewarm, ask Jesus to stir your hearts and rekindle your zeal for Him.

We should all also ask Jesus to embolden us with His Power and Presence. To pray along with so many this week 'Thy Kingdom come'. To continually share the Good news of Jesus and His love with everyone. To keep doing our bit for the goodness of our society and communities. To be at the forefront of social justice. To boldly move forward. To embrace new opportunities as a church and as individuals. **Amen.**
