EMAIL SCAM

Many of you will be aware that our Secretary, Clare, recently received an email purporting to come from the Minister, Ruth, but it was in fact from an incorrect email address, and not from Ruth, at all!

If anyone receives anything suspicious the Government web site (www.gov.uk) provides contact details for the National Cyber Security Centre (www.ncsc.gov.uk) where you will find a great deal of information including reporting potential phishing messages to the "Suspicious Email Reporting Service(SERS)" at "report@phishing.gov.uk".

There is also a lot of information and advice on the Metropolitan Police web site (www.met.police.uk)

You can also find further information at "Action Fraud" (www.actionfraud.police.uk) where you can again report various fraud or cyber crime, although there are also details for certain types of fraud where reports should be made direct to specific areas.

Remember if you receive an unusual or suspicious email, text or phone call then it is probably not genuine - Take care and exercise caution, end any calls, and do not click on any link or open attachments and then report.

There are a lot of scammers out there, and fraudsters are very active at the present time in the run up to Christmas.
Please exercise care and stay safe.

WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT

My lovely Commissioning service and celebration as a URC Synod Accredited Lay Preacher, on Sunday, 19th January 2020 felt like it happened in another year. I continue to thank Lord Jesus immensely for His call and love.

However, none of us could have imagined that a month or so after the celebration, a virus called COVID -19 will disrupt the year causing so much devastation and difficulty across most of the world.
