

## **PASTORAL LETTER**

Our Church year for these meetings runs from 1 April to 31 March. It is also good to think of some better situations, including the birth of little ones, some recently, who are the Great Grand Children of Church Members. We remember the recent “Dedication” Service here at Church, and also think of forthcoming Weddings, and purely now being able to meet up again with Friends and Family. Indeed, simply hearing from old friends by letter or phone is so lovely.

Now that the weather is a little better, we are thankful that we can get out and about to visit people and places, carry out well loved hobbies and pastimes, including “Reading”, especially for those who like to sit in the sun with a good book, or perhaps just go for a picnic somewhere (Don’t forget the “Church Picnic” on Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> June).

## **CHRISTIAN AID SERVICE**

On the 9<sup>th</sup> May Ruth led a very special Christian Aid service. After 75 years of “Christian Aid” street collecting in the UK, we were unable to collect in May 2020 and again in Lockdown this May too. However, we put out advanced notices, appeals and posters. The Media also advertised the event. So far Christian Aid tell me the campaign is going very well. We opened with a welcoming smile from Ruth and “song” (no, not yet) we moved to the music! This was our 1<sup>st</sup> service using the brand-new on-line screening equipment. Robert and Diana did very well, operating this, having had training.

Ruth asked us to write out the alphabet on a sheet of paper and we used the initial sounds to write words of strong meaning for us, especially, reflecting climate change and effect of Lockdown.

Ruth then collected some of these words, many people had written down the names of their family members or animals. Sara Skinner read John 15 v 5-18 which begins with Jesus saying “I am the vine and my Father is the gardener” and “you are the branches”. This ends with Jesus commanding us to “love one another” as we are united and bound together, as friends and bearers of the vine’s fruit.

Using some of the Christian Aid’s materials we watched a video about Rose. She lives in Kenya and is battling the effects of climate change making life for her even more difficult. In Kenya they pray for rain and Rose has to walk 8km to collect water with her donkey. She says” Fetching water takes me 6 hours because I am old and can’t walk very fast. The drought has been so severe, we are suffering”. Added to her plight she lives with HIV and struggles to eat well due to lack of water for her crops. She is the sole carer for her six grandchildren. Christian Aid have been working in Kenya since 1997.

We can all do our bit to help slow down the impact of climate change. Ruth praised the prophetic voices now bringing the issues of climate change passionately to our attention. Some of us signed the petition calling for climate justice.

Ruth told us how Holly Park, year 4 classes had been to visit the Church, enthusiastic and lively children. Some had never been in Church before. As the former “RE” co-ordinator at Holly Park for many years, I recognised the description of Holly Park children, full of pertinent questions and interest!

They asked about the building, windows, Church features and Christian practices. Ruth had pointed out the beautiful vine designs with purple grapes on all the windows encircling the Church. These are a very special feature of our Church and symbolize the binding of our Church community to link together and know that Jesus is the vine and we are the bearers of the father’s fruit to work, love and serve each other.

Thank you, Ruth for a wonderful service.
